
- 1. What is inspiring you today? (Ah-ha moment, new way of approaching your work, person/org, etc.)

THEMES

CSH undertook a qualitative analytical approach, conducting focus groups with five categories of stakeholders, including housing providers, shelter operators, service providers, Designated Agencies, and individuals with lived experience of homelessness. There was significant overlap of general themes:

Cross-systems alignment

Barriers attributed to low housing stock

Behavioral health acuity and support

Workforce needs
